Bishop-elect Gavin succeeds Bishop John
Buckley who has served the diocese of Cork &
Ross for over thirty-five years — as an Auxiliary
Bishop from 1984-1997 and, from then to the
present day as bishop of the diocese.
In his address after Tuesday morning Mass in
the Cathedral of Saint Mary and Saint Anne in
Cork City, Bishop-elect Gavin said he was,
"conscious of those who have felt let down by
the Church and are just 'hanging in there'."
He encouraged them "not to give up".

The -53year-old also said that leaving his life and ministry in Dublin will not be easy. He said, "I was very happily serving the Church as an ordinary priest in the Archdiocese of Dublin during the last 27 years since I was ordained in various different ministries. And as a North Side Dubliner I would never have expected such trust to be placed in me by Pope Francis by asking me to serve as a humble servant leader, the People of God, the Body of Christ of the Diocese of Cork & Ross."

Bishop Buckley said, "It is a great honour for a Dublin man to be promoted to the real capital of Cork! We always think down here that there are only two categories of people in Ireland, Cork people and those who wish they were Cork people!
