**Tuesday 11<sup>th</sup> Octobe Feast Day of Pope John XXIII.** Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli, the man who would become Pope John XXIII, was born to a family of farmers in the tiny village of Sotto II Monte, near Bergamo, Northern Italy in November 1881.

After he became Pope in 1958 at the age of 76 he eschewed the trappings of his position, and refused to take advantage of it either for himself or his family.

In his last will and testament, Pope John XXIII wrote: *"Born poor, but of humble and respected folk, I am particularly happy to die poor".* 

"I thank God for this grace of poverty to which I vowed fidelity in my youth... which has strengthened me in my resolve never to ask for anything – positions, money or favors – never either for myself of for my relations and friends." LENS OF THE GOSPEL

#### Twenty Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The cure of the lepers is not just a physical cure, it also brought the people healed back from exclusion into the community. Perhaps you have experienced the movement from exclusion to inclusion. What was it like for you to be accepted once again when you had felt excluded?

When we do good for another, we may not do it for the thanks we hope to get, but it can hurt when no gratitude is shown. Sometimes it is those closest to us who can take us for granted. What helps you to cope in such circumstances
