FEAST DAYS WEEK

WED 9th NOV '22 - St. John Lateran

Most Catholics think of St. Peter's as the pope's main church, but they are wrong. St. John Lateran is the pope's church, the cathedral of the Diocese of Rome where the Bishop of Rome presides. The first basilica on the site was built in the fourth century when Constantine donated land he had received from the wealthy Lateran family. That structure and its successors suffered fire, earthquake, and the ravages of war, but the Lateran remained the church where popes were consecrated. In the 14th century when the papacy returned to Rome from Avignon, the church and the adjoining palace were found to be in ruins. Pope Innocent X commissioned the present structure in 1646. One of Rome's most imposing churches. Beneath its high altar rest the remains of the small wooden table on which tradition holds Saint Peter himself celebrated Mass.

THU 10th NOV '22 - St Leo the Great, (1) Pope and Doctor of the Church (400-461)

Pope Leo the Great was a layman when chosen for the office; he was able to keep the invaders from the north - the Huns and the Vandals - at bay; he was a focus for unity in the Church; and he gave powerful expression to the dignity of all Christians who believe in the incarnation of Jesus, truly God and truly human. Leo also combatted heresy. 'The integral and true faith is a great bulwark to which nothing can be added or taken from by anyone.' In his encyclical Aeterna Dei Sapientia (1961), Pope John XXIII wrote, 'St. Leo is celebrated above all as the Doctor of the unity of the Church.'

FRI 11th NOV '22 - St. Martin of Tours

Martin was born in Hungary in 316, son of a pagan army officer. At the age of 10, and against his parents' will, he became a catechumen. Several years later, his love of God was so intense that he wanted to become a hermit. However, he was compelled to go into the service when he was 15. In Amiens, France, during the bitterly cold winter of 337, he was approached by an almostnaked beggar. Martin immediately sliced his cloak in two and wrapped half of it around the shivering vagrant. According to his biographer, Christopher Donaldson, that night Martin had a dream. He saw Jesus wrapped in the piece of cloak and Jesus said: "Martin, yet a catechumen, has covered me with this garment."

SAT 12th NOV '22 - St Josaphat, Bishop, Martyr

St Josaphat, Bishop, Martyr, born in Vladimir (Ukraine) in 1580, and died at Vitebsk (Belarus) on this day in 1623. A Basilian monk who became archbishop of Polotsk, worked strenuously to uphold and spread the Union of Brest-Litovsk by which Churches of the province of Kiev, with their Byzantine liturgy and customs had entered into communion with Rome. In a complex situation of national and religious antagonism, he was killed by violent opponents.
