## MON 14<sup>th</sup> NOV '22 - St. Laurence O'Toole

Laurence O'Toole was born in Castledermot, Co. Kildare in 1128. His father was Maurice O'Toole, King of Hy Murray In 1162 he waas chosed ast the first native Archbishop of Dublin. He followed reforming methods of Cellach ands Malachy, introducing the Canons Regular to minister in the Cathedral, upholding the rights od the Church, caring for the people. He attended the Thrid Lateran Council in 1179 and, returning as Papal Legate, he held synods to extend reform. He worked for peach and reconciliation and died on a mission of mediation with King Henry 11 and the Irish ruler of Eu in Normandy in 1180. Archbishop of Dublin during the takeover of Ireland by the Normans and King Henry II, his efforts in the peace process and his frustration with King Henry probably caused his early death. Highly honoured at Eu in Normandy, France, where he died.

# THU 17<sup>th</sup> NOV '22 - St. Elizabeth of Hungary

In her short life, Elizabeth manifested such great love for the poor and suffering that she has become the patroness of Catholic charities and of the Secular Franciscan Order. The daughter of the King of Hungary, Elizabeth chose a life of penance and asceticism. At the age of 14, Elizabeth was married to Louis of Thuringia, whom she deeply loved. She bore three children. Under the spiritual direction of a Franciscan friar, she led a life of prayer, sacrifice, and service to the poor and sick. After six years of marriage, her husband died in the Crusades. In 1228, Elizabeth joined the Secular Franciscan Order, spending the remaining few years of her life caring for the poor in a hospital which she founded in honor of Saint Francis of Assisi. Elizabeth's health declined, and she died before her 24th birthday in 1231. Her great popularity resulted in her canonization four years later.
