FEAST DAYS OF THE WEEK

MON 06th MAR - ST. KIERAN OF SAIGIR was born in Cape Clear, Co. Cork. He is numbered among the pre-Patrician saints of Ireland. He went to the Continent, where he was baptised and later ordained priest and bishop. He returned to his father' territory, Ossory, where he lived as a hermit. Disciples soon joined him and Saigir became a well-known monastery.

TUE 7th MAR - SS PERPETUA AND FELICITY - are two women who were martyred in the city of Carthage in North Africa (present-day Tunisia) and received great veneration from the 4th century onwards. The Passion of Saints Perpetua and Felicity is a journal by the 22year old Perpetua, who had given birth to a son a few months before. It tells of her trial and imprisonment and was continued by a contemporary who described Perpetua's martyrdom in the arena. Perpetua was a young married woman of twenty-two and Felicity a slave-girl, far advanced in pregnancy. They were still catechumens when they were arrested at Carthage (near Tunis in present-day Tunisia) with four male catechumens under an edict of Emperor Septimius Severus (193-211) that forbade fresh conversions to Christianity.

WED 8th MAR - ST. JOHN OF GOD - John's life was totally changed after hearing a sermon preached by Saint John d'Avila in Granada. His response was very dramatic when he became acutely aware of God's love for him and the emptiness of his life in return. His distressed appeal to God for mercy and forgiveness led to his incarceration in the Royal Hospital for the mentally ill. As a result of this experience, John took up the call to serve the poor and the sick because of the mistreatment of patients he had witnessed and experienced in the hospital. In 1630, John was declared Blessed by Pope Urban VIII and was later declared a Saint and canonised in 1690 by Pope Alexander VIII. In 1886, he was proclaimed patron of hospitals and the sick, and in 1930, he was further proclaimed patron saint of nurses and their associations by Pope Pius XI.
