FEAST DAYS WEEK COMMENCING 5th JUNE '23

MON 05th JUN - ST. BONIFACE BISHOP & MARTYR - an English monk from Exeter, he evangelised first among the Frisians (Holland), then visited Pope Gregory II in Rome, and then had a very successful apostolate across north-western Europe. The visitor, called Wynfrith, who had entered the monastery in Exeter at the age of seven was to be one of the makers of Christ¬ian Europe. After studying in Exeter he became an eminent teacher in the monastery, where he composed poetry and innu¬merable riddles and wrote a Latin grammar, but, at the age of forty, conscious of his Saxon descent, he felt called to minister to the Saxon pagans in their German homeland.

WED 07th **JUN - ST COLMAN OF DROMORE -** Bishop: Colman (Mocholmoc) of Dromore, County Down, is said to have studied under Caetan of Nendrom He was persuaded by Mac Nissi to settle at Dromore around 514. His cult is also found in Scotland and Wales. St. Colman of Dromore, in the Lagan valley of Co Down, Northern Ireland, set up a monastery here at the beginning of the sixth century. The present diocese of Dromore, however, has its seat in the south Co Down city of Newry.

FRI 09th JUN - ST COLUMBA, abbot, missionary also known as Colum Cille, was born in Gartan, County Donegal in 521 and was of royal lineage. He studied under Finnian of Moville and Finnian of Clonard. He founded monasteries in Deny, Durrow, Iona and possibly Kells. From Iona, which became his principal foundation, missionaries undertook the conversion of Northumbria. Colum Cille is noted for his love for people and for all living creatures. He died in 597. In 563, Columba and twelve companions sailed from Derry via Moville to the island of Iona to establish a new monastery there. St Adomnán, who wrote his Life of Columba in Iona within a century of the saint's death, gives Columba's reason for exile as a desire to be "a pilgrim for Christ". Iona is a small island south-west of the larger Mull, about eighty miles north of Co Antrim. In Columba's time, it lay within the Irish territory of Dál Riada, which was divided by the North Channel between Ireland and Scotland. For Columba, personal sanctification took precedence even over preaching the Gospel. Monastic life in Iona was identical to that at home in Ireland: work, mortification, prayer, study, and copying manuscripts, were the order of the day.
