FEAST DAYS WEEK COMMENCING 15th MAY '23

MON 15th MAY - ST. CARTHAGE, BISHOP - Born in County Kerry towards the end of the 6th century. Drawn to the monastic life by hearing the chanting of psalms he took his name from his teacher, Carthage the Elder. His major monastic settlement for nearly forty years was in Rahan, County Offaly. Exiled from there he came with his monks towards this County and was given this site "Moccody's Hill" by the Chiefs of the Deise in 635. He died in 637 having lived his last 18 months as a hermit.

TUE 16th MAY - ST. BRENDAN ABBOTT (The Navigator) - Born in Annagh, Co. Kerry in 484. Very little is known about his life when he was young, but reports told how brightly lit angels hovered over the house when he was born. He was ordained a priest by Bishop Erc in 512. He set up a lot of monasteries in Ireland. One was set up at Ardfert, at the foot of Mount Brandan in Co. Kerry. The most famous one was at Clonfert in Co. Galway. That monastery was set up in 560, almost 1,500 years ago! Today there is a big cathedral at Clonfert where he is buried. St Brendan the Navigator of all the Irish saints, he was the most adventurous. On some of his earlier ventures, he visited Britain, many of the islands off the coast of Scotland and possibly even Iceland. St. Brendan's longest adventure at sea was still to come. A manuscript was written in the 9th century that tells the story of his famous voyage in search of Hy Brasail, or the Island of the Blessed. This manuscript is called Navigatio Sancti Brendani Abbatis. That is Latin for 'Voyage of St. Brendan the Abbot'. This voyage lasted for seven years. St Brendan died in 578 at Annaghdown.

'If you love me, you will keep my commandments', specifically commandment to love one another (cf.13.34). How have you experienced the link between love of God and love of those around you? Jesus is preparing disciples for his imminent departure and for a future in which he would be with them in a different way. He would not 'leave them orphans' but send an 'Advocate' to 'be with (them) for ever'. 'He is with you, he is in you'. How have you experienced the presence of God with you in your life? Perhaps you have also experienced challenge of preparing another (a child, a friend) for a time when you would no physically longer be together. Recall how you gave the message of your ongoing support. How have experienced presence and support of a loved one (parent, spouse, friend) when circumstances have separated you from them?
