### Feast Days Week Commencing 11 Dec '23

# Our Lady of Guadalupe Tuesday, December 12.

This special Feast celebrates the apparition of the appearance of the Blessed Virgin Mary to (now) Saint Juan Diego outside of Mexico City in 1531. Pope John Paul II confirmed the validity of this revelation and declared Our Lady of Guadalupe to be the Patroness of all the Americas.

This feast is a holy day of obligation in the country of Mexico, and Our Lady of Guadalupe is highly honored in that country

**St. John of the Cross Thursday Dec 14** John was born in Fontiveros, a small town between Avila and Salamanca in Spain. His father died when he was about a year old and his mother was left to bring up three children in poverty. John was sent to an orphanage where he learned to read and write. However, although he was apprenticed to different trades, John didn't show himself to be much good at any of them. **By** fifteen, he was performing menial tasks in a hospital for people suffering from venereal diseases. The administrator of the hospital spotted his intelligence and sent him to the Jesuit College in Medina del Campo, telling him if he got ordained a priest he could be the hospital chaplain. After four years study, John felt an attraction to become a Carthusian, but became a Carmelite and studied theology at Salamanca.

#### **LENS OF THE GOSPEL**

Second Sunday in Advent. **'23** Mark opens his gospel by describing it as 'the good news about Jesus Christ'. Think of the different ways in which the gospel stories have been good news for you. John the Baptist is presented as a messenger to prepare the way for Jesus. Who have been messengers to you, preparing the way for the Lord by alerting you to ways your life? To whom have you been such a messenger? John calls the people to repentance (= a change of heart), as a way to a new life. Can you recall times when you had a change of heart, and the change revitalised you? John baptised people with water as a gesture to mark their change of heart. Sometimes we perform an action to symbolise our change of heart – write a letter, throw away our last cigarettes, etc. Can you remember a symbolic gesture with which you marked a change of heart?
